- Investment in the technological renovation of the facilities.
- Environmental certification. The production does not produce waste, everything is used.
- Modern electrical wiring.
- Planning to implement solar energy in the production.

11 SUSTAINABLE CITIES AND COMMUNITIES



- Permanent commitment to improve the quality and quantity of production.
- Donations of flours and by-products permanently for institutions of public good that elaborate bread and food.
- Creation decent work and promotes education and health in the community.

The Mill cooperative and the SDG'S



- Grinding capacity of 220 Tons per day.
- The coop produces first quality products at fair prices.
- The mill supplies its locality, the surrounding towns and distributes fractioned flour in Greater Buenos Aires.
- Integrated with two Federations (Workers and Consumers) and networking with many cooperatives in Saladillo: agricultural, the cooperative Bank, the electric Cooperative, a School Cooperative, the coop Radio.
